Year 2 SATs Parents' Information Meeting

What are SAT's?



At the end of year 2, children are assessed on their maths, reading and writing ability.

SATs are just one of the range of strategies teachers use to assess children. They aren't about passing or failing, but are used to reflect the level your child is working at and to inform teachers in making their judgements of children's progress and attainment.



The Year 2 tests must be conducted during May.

Monday 16th May - Friday 20th May.

How are the tests carried out?

The tests will be completed in a normal classroom environment during lesson time. They take between twenty and forty minutes, but they are not strictly timed.

Support can and will be given in line with the test rules and where appropriate children will be given resources to support them.

They will be marked by the teachers.



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Absolutely not!

All we ask is for the children to do their best.

The test is based on things they will have learnt in KS1 so they will be able to attempt most of it.

What will the children need to do?


<u>There are two mathematics papers:</u> Paper 1: arithmetic Paper 2: reasoning

<u>There are two grammar, punctuation and spelling papers:</u> Paper 1: spelling Paper 2: grammar


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<u>There are two reading papers:</u> Paper 1: reading and answering questions Paper 2: reading and answering questions

Example questions - English


Reading - Paper 1 and Paper 2

Children will be given a selection of texts and questions which will focus on what they have just read. The second paper will include separate texts which are more challenging than the first.

Bella Goes To Sea

Bella the goose lived with William in a cottage by the sea. William was a fisherman. He had a big garden with lots of good grass for Bella to eat. Sometimes for a treat he took Bella to the Harbour Cafe and bought her a milkshake and biscuits. But whenever William went to sea, Bella had to stay behind. "You can guard the house," he said.





Writing

There is no test for Writing.

Instead, your child's teacher will consider a range of your child's written work over the year in order to decide if they have met the expected standard.

These judgements will include looking at your child's handwriting, their use of punctuation, spelling, grammar and whether they can write coherently.

What happens if my child misses a test?

We have a window of time to complete SATs tests.

If a child misses a test, they can take it when they return to school as long as the test window is open.

What about the results?

The test results will be used to help teachers make an end of Year 2 teacher assessment judgment.

Teachers will use the tests, other assessment information and the children's work across the year along with other evidence they have seen in the classroom, to make a judgement about their progress and attainment.

What are the possible results?

For English reading, English writing and maths, each judgement reports if a pupil is:

- working towards the expected standard
- working at the expected standard
- working at greater depth within the expected standard

Results will be released in July and sent home with the end of year report.
