### **Assistant Headteacher Update**



We hope you all had an enjoyable and relaxing summer together. It has been lovely to have the children back in school and hear about what they got up to. We are incredibly proud of the maturity the children have shown in transitioning from Reception to Year 1. The children have shown great resilience in applying what they learnt in Reception to their new classrooms in Year 1. It has been lovely to walk through and see how calm and engaged they are in their learning.

Year 1 have been busy starting their new topics and getting fully immersed in their learning. In humanities, they have begun looking at the Victorians. They started off with a hook lesson using their classroom maps of the United Kingdom. They discussed the four countries and the history behind these countries. They have then moved onto looking at historical artefacts and what they tell us about the Victorian period. Over the next few weeks, they will be learning about Queen Victoria in preparation for their trip to Sandringham.

In writing, Year 1 have started their descriptive writing unit based on 'The Gruffalo.' The children have been focusing on adjectives and noun phrases to describe the different characters. In maths, the children are deepening their understanding with their number to 10. This week they have been learning to write the numbers in words to 10 and finding more or less. We want to extend on their knowledge from Reception and enable them to apply their skills in a variety of ways. Year 1's first unit in science is animals, where the children will be identifying different animals and looking at different animal groups.


What a busy first two weeks it has been for Year 1! We are excited to see the progress and achievements of the children over the course of the term.



#### Do you have a concern about a child?

Hampton Vale Primary Academy is committed to safeguarding and promoting the welfare of children and expects all staff, governors and volunteers to share this commitment.

At Hampton Vale there is nothing more important to us than the physical health, emotional health and well-being of our pupils and staff alike.

If you have any concerns about a child, you can contact or speak to your child's class teacher/teaching assistant before or after school, speak to a member of the Senior Leadership Team or our Safeguarding Lead. All our staff will always listen to concerns about the safety and wellbeing of a child. You can also email <u>safeguarding@hvp.org.uk</u>.

A safeguarding concern is anything that makes you feel worried or uncomfortable about a child or concerned that a child may be at risk of harm or at risk of harming another. This includes your perception of the risk of radicalisation, sexual exploitation and any other form of child abuse (emotional, physical, neglect or sexual). It also includes self-harm or the use of drugs/alcohol.

We have a number of policies and procedures in place that contribute to our safeguarding commitment, including our Child Protection Policy. This can be found in the Safeguarding section of our website.

The Academy has a safeguarding team led by the Deputy Safeguarding Lead, Mrs Wright and Designated Safeguarding and Prevent Lead, Miss Thomas.

#### **Online Safety: Parental Controls**

These controls are designed to help you manage your child's online activities. Parental controls can set online time restrictions for your child and create content filters to manage the content they see. Parental controls can be used across your broadband, Wi-Fi, apps, games consoles and personal devices including mobile phones and tablets. There are various types, some of which are free but others which can be bought.

You can find instructions on how to set controls on the manufacturer's website or to find specific guidance for your device, network or platform use this online tool from Internet Matters.

Control settings will apply whether the device is being used in your home or outside. It's also easy for controls to be switched off, so make sure your child understands why the settings are in place.

#### You can put parental controls on the following:

- Games consoles controls
- Broadband and network controls to prevent inappropriate material
- Online controls Google and other search engines
- Social media and other websites Youtube have privacy and security settings
- Paid controls you can buy filter programmes

#### 5 actions for setting parental controls:

- 1. Set up home broadband parental controls
- Set controls on your search engine and encourage your child to use child friendly search engines and activate and lock the safe search setting on the platforms/browsers they use
- Set privacy settings on apps and devices: activate the safety measures offered by different sites
- 4. Block pop-ups to reduce accidentally clicking on inappropriate material
- Have open conversations with your child about online safety and reassure them they
  can talk to you or a trusted adult whenever they need to
