### **Assistant Headteacher Update**



Another two weeks have flown by in Year 1 and what a busy two weeks it has been!

The children are continuing to enjoy their topic of 'Victorians'. They have learnt who Queen Victoria was and what she did during the Victorian times. They have looked at Queen Victoria's family tree and her husband Prince Albert. It has been very interesting to learn lots of information about Queen Victoria. The children were amazed to find out Queen Victoria became Queen at 18 years old and she had 9 children with Prince Albert. Year 1's trip to Sandringham will support their learning so far and immerse them in Victorian life. All of Year 1 are very excited for their visit!

During the writing lessons, Year 1 have started their new writing unit based on the book 'Monkey Puzzle'. Within this unit, the children are focusing on setting descriptions and using a range of descriptive vocabulary to describe different places. A key focus is using noun phrases and expanded noun phrases in sentences to describe things they see in the setting. As a starting point, the children explored the school field, walking round and identifying adjectives to describe the setting. They will then be applying this knowledge to settings from the story for their own writing. I can't wait to read the amazing descriptions from Year 1!

The maths focus has been comparing numbers and ordering numbers. The children have been using concrete resources and pictorial representations to support them. I had the pleasure of looking through some of Year 1's maths books this week and I am so impressed with the skill and progression the children are showing.


Year 1 have been working very hard and it is lovely to walk through and see so many children engaged with their learning!





### Online Safety:

Our children at HVPA use a range of different games and social media platforms and it is essential that they safeguard themselves on these platforms. Here is a handy guide to SnapChat from Internet Matters.



Snapchot is a photo- and video-sharing app which also allows users to chat with friends via text or audio Users can share images and videos with specific friends, or through a "story" (documenting the previous 24 hours) visible to their entire friend list. Snapchot usage rose during the pondemic, with many young people utilizing it to connect with their peers. The app continues to develop features to engage an even larger audience and emulate current trends, rivalling platforms such as Tistek and instagram.

### CONNECTING WITH STRANGERS

tiven if your child only connects on the app with people they know, they may still receive friend requests from strangers, snapchafts links with appeauen as winx and froop have increased this possibility. Accepting a request means that children are then disclosing personal information through the Story, Snapklap and Spottight features. This could allow predators to gain their trust for sinister purposes.

### EXCESSIVE USE

There are many features that are attractive to users and keep them excited about the app. Snop streaks encourage users to send snaps doily. Spotlight Challenges give users to the chance to obtain money and online fame, and the Spotlight feature's scral of videos makes it says for children to spend hours watching content.

### INAPPROPRIATE CONTENT

Some videos and posts on Snapchat are not suitable for children. The heatings used to group content are determined by the poster, so an innocent search term could still yield age-inappropriate results. The app's Discover function lets users swips through snippets of naw atories and trending criticies that often include adult content. There is currently no way to turn off this feature.

### SEXTING

seating continues to be a risk associated with snapchal. The app's disappearing messages feature makes it easy for young people (seens in particular) to share explicit images on impulse. While these pictures do disappear — and the sender is notified if it has been screenshotted first—users have found alternative methods to sees impulse.

### DAMAGE TO CONFIDENCE

Snopchot's filters and lenges Snopchot's filters and lenses one a popular way for users to enhance their wolfe game.

Although many are designed to entertain ar amuse, the bocutty filters on photos can set unrealistic body image expectations and creat feelings of inadequate. Comparing themselves unfavourably against other Snopchat users could threaten a child's confidence or sense of self-worth.


### VISIBLE LOCATION

My Pioces lets users check in ord search for popular spots nearby - such as restaurants, parks or shapping centires - sond recommend them to their friends. The potential issue with a young person consistently checking into locations on snapchat is that it allows other users in their friends list (even people they have only ever met online) to see where they currently are and where they regularly ge.


