Assistant Headteacher Update

I cannot believe that it is almost half term, the weeks are flying by very quickly. Thank you for your support with the School Census lunch last Thursday, as the Census helps to determine the school's funding. The children certainly enjoyed their burgers, adding their own toppings as well as the chocolate cake and ice cream.

In Year 2, the children have been reading the book 'There is No Dragon in This Story' which is both entertaining and enjoyable. The dragon goes on a mission to find a story that he can be part of but nobody wants him to be in their fairytale. Just as the dragon is about to give up, the giant from 'Jack and the Beanstalk' sneezes and blows out the sun so the fairytale land becomes dark. The dragon is the only one who can help as he blows his fire to relight the sun and becomes a hero! The children liked that the hero in the book was a dragon as this is normally an evil character that captures the princess. The children have been linking their own knowledge to the text by identifying the different fairy tales they spot throughout the book e.g 'Three Little Pigs', 'The Gingerbread Man', 'Goldilocks' and 'Pinocchio' and many more.

In writing, Year 2 has been writing a diary entry from the perspective of Traction Man. Traction Man was our guided reading book in the first week of term and the children enjoyed reading about his adventures. Every writing lesson we have put on our Traction Man hat and imagined that we are either diving in the lost wreck of the sieve, saving the dollies from the wicked Professor Spade or rescuing Scrubbing Brush from the Mysterious Toes! The children have been applying their writing toolkit by using lots of exciting vocabulary, conjunctions and first person pronouns. When writing our diary, we focused on writing in chronological order and the children now understand that chronological means the order in which events happen.

In Science, Year 2 has been investigating materials and their uses. The children were asked to design a bridge using only one material - paper, card, wood or plastic. Children not only had to look at the material they had chosen but also the structure of the bridge. Many children opted for a triangular base as this proves to be a very common shape used in the construction of bridges. The purpose of this investigation was to explore which material was the strongest for building a bridge and we tested this by driving toy cars across it. The children were very surprised at the results as the paper proved to be quite strong. Alongside our investigation, we have also been discovering different scientists and why their jobs are important. It is great to see the children thinking scientifically and recognising the importance of scientists in society - we may have some future scientists in the making!

On the days when children come to school in their PE kit, please can we remind you that their kit must follow our school uniform policy. PE kits include a plain white t-shirt and royal blue shorts. However, with the colder months now upon us, children may also wear a royal blue hoodie and either black, grey or navy jogging bottoms.
