## Assistant Headteacher Update



Please remember next week is the final week of the Autumn Term. Children may wear their Christmas jumpers on Monday and Tuesday, but they must continue to wear the rest of their school uniform. Monday after school is our Christmas Fayre and we hope that you can all make it. Wednesday, 21st. is our last day, we will be finishing at 12:30 and children are able to wear their own clothes on that day.

In Year 2, we have been writing a Christmas themed story with Percy Pig from the M&S Christmas food advert as the main magical character. It is Percy's very first Christmas and he goes on a Christmas adventure. The children will be using their wonderful imaginations to create a story using exciting vocabulary and a range of sentence types.

In maths, the children have been telling the time using o'clock, half past, quarter to and quarter past. Please encourage your children to start telling the time at home too and you could also incorporate time related vocabulary into your conversations, for example 'It's 8 o'clock, so time for bed.' We would like more confident children to tell the time to the nearest five minutes. We have also been exploring money and making amounts using different combinations of coins which the children have thoroughly enjoyed. Perhaps if you are out shopping over the Christmas holidays, you could show your children the price labels on items in the shops, ask them to read the amount and, if you have any coins, perhaps make that amount. After Christmas, we will be learning all about fractions of shapes and fractions of amounts. Again, this vocabulary could be used in everyday conversations at home such as 'We will each have a quarter of the pizza for dinner.'

In humanities, we have started the final part of our topic 'London in the 1600's'. In this part of the topic, we look in detail at the Great Plague of 1665. We explore the causes, symptoms, that part played by Plague Doctors and how the Great Plague was eradicated.

Thank you for your continued support over the Autumn Term. We hope that you enjoy the Christmas holidays and have a fun filled, yet relaxing time. If you are celebrating, we wish you a Merry Christmas and a Happy New Year and we look forward to seeing you on 4th. January for the beginning of the Spring term and the start of our new and exciting topic

# HVPA Safeguarding



## Keeping your child safe in the community

With the recent sudden drop in temperatures, and the high amount of lakes in our local community, it is increasingly more important to ensure that your child/ren understand how to keep themselves safe.

The dangers of thin ice, as our local lakes start to freeze, is significant and children may feel tempted to want to explore this change in the environment.

Across school, we have had in depth discussions regarding the dangers of thin ice, and we ask that you follow this up at home, particularly if your child walks home alone/is out in the community alone.



### Key points to discuss with your child:

- You can never be sure how frozen a lake is, and with the water frozen or not the risk of drowning is a serious threat.
- The ice may look thick enough to hold your weight, but you can't assume this. In most cases this can cause a fatal threat.
- Each and every year, people unexpectedly break through the ice and suffer serious injuries or even death.
- Cold water shock is a serious risk if you fall through the ice - this is where you automatically gasp for air, but breathe in liquid.
- Always stay with friends when out alone playing/walking home in case of an emergency.
- Avoid the lakes to ensure safety.

### **Peterborough City Council's Winter Warmth Funding 2022/23**

Funding is available through the cost-of-living crisis for a range of measures to help vulnerable, lower income residents through the winter months.

If you are facing problems with maintaining a warm and comfortable home environment, we may be able to assist with the following measures:

- Boiler replacements - due to breakdowns / energy inefficiency – including the loan of emergency portable heaters whilst work is on order
- Boiler repairs up to £500
- Boiler servicing
- Installation of Thermostatic Radiator Valves to control room temperatures
- Smart boiler / heating controls where appropriate
- Damp proofing
- Essential repairs linked to electrical and heating issues
- Electrical upgrades and new installations
- Double glazing of single glazed door and windows
- Valves on LPG cylinders to meet new Building Control requirements
- Dehumidifiers to mitigate condensation damp where appropriate
- Small energy efficient electrical appliances where appropriate
- Loft insulation when there is currently less than 100mm of insulation

All of the measures above are subject to a property survey, except for:

- Boiler servicing
- Valves on LPG cylinders to meet new Building Control requirements
- Small energy efficient electrical appliances where appropriate

#### **Eligibility criteria**

To be eligible for this scheme, the homeowner must reside in the Peterborough unitary authority area. The homeowner must also be in receipt of one of the following:

- Income-related Employment and Support Allowance
- Income-based Jobseeker's Allowance
- Income Support
- Pension Guarantee Credit
- Child Tax Credit / Working Tax Credit
- Universal Credit

Or has:

- A total annual gross household income less than £30,000
