Assistant Headteacher Update



There is certainly an air of excitement in school at the moment. We have been visited by a naughty elf, Elfvis. So far he has caused lots of mischief, which the children have loved to find and report to us all every morning. We hope you have enjoyed hearing about it too and we cannot wait to see what he will get up to over the next few weeks.

In science, the children have explored various scientists and their contributions to the world. In our materials topic, we have looked at Charles Macintosh - the man who invented the raincoat. Learning about significant people in science helps children understand the world around them and inspires their scientific thinking. This week, we have started our new topic 'Animals Including Humans' where we will look at what animals and humans need for survival and the importance of a healthy lifestyle.

In writing, we have been honing our journalistic skills by studying newspapers and their features. We have been looking at different articles and comparing their structural similarities. After reading the articles, we have written our own eye-catching headlines and quotes! Using what we have learned, we will be writing our own articles. We are wondering if there will be a budding new journalist in our midst who will be sure to get the hot new scoop!

In History we are continuing with our work on the Stone Age, looking at early human structures and using our knowledge to design and make our own versions of Stonehenge in art!

In maths, we will be having a big focus on multiplying, particularly by 2, 3, 5 and 10 and looking at what a multiple is. To support this, perhaps you could challenge your children on these timetables and see who is quickest.

Our class teachers are continuing to set homework each week on Google Classrooms, but if you are looking for some extra activities, one of the many things children love to do at this time of year is to send Christmas cards. Christmas cards are a great way for your child to practise their writing as well as their handwriting and we encourage them to do as much as they can on their own. We have our own postbox in school where we would like to invite all children to post their cards. These will then be delivered to the children in their classes. However, to support the delivery process, please take a look at the Christmas letter you received which explains how to set out the envelope. Writing envelopes is another skill that your child can practise as they write their cards.

Keep your child safe on WhatsApp

What are the risks?

- Bullying, particularly in group chats
- Seeing content of a sexual nature, or showing violence and hatred
- Settings that allow messages to disappear after 24 hours or 7 days
- Sharing their live location, particularly with people they don't know in person
- Spam or hoax messages
- Being exposed to strangers through group chats
- WhatsApp says the minimum age to use it is 16, but younger children can still use it easily

6 steps to help your child use WhatsApp safely

- 1. Keep their personal information and location private
- Remind your child to be careful about what they share
- 3. Remind your child to remember that they can leave group chats
- Make sure your child knows how to report and block people
- Encourage your child to watch out for spam and hoax messages

Tell us at HVPA about any bullying your child experiences - look for signs like being afraid or reluctant to go to school, feeling nervous, losing confidence or becoming distressed and withdrawn, or losing sleep.


