
Year 3 News

Assistant Headteacher Update



I cannot believe that it is almost half term, the weeks are flying by very quickly. Thank you for your support with the School Census lunch last Thursday, as the Census helps to determine the school's funding. The children certainly enjoyed their burgers, adding their own toppings as well as the chocolate cake and ice cream.

In writing this week we are using the book we have recently read, 'The Tin Forest', as well as the book we are currently reading, 'Charlie and the Chocolate Factory', to help us understand how the author uses descriptive language for a setting to enable us to create a picture of it in our minds. We will be using both of these books as stimuli in the following weeks to aid us in writing our own setting descriptions and we cannot wait to see how the children will describe their chosen locations. In preparation for this writing, you could perhaps ask your child to describe different surroundings, for example the setting when you take the dog for a walk, go to a friend or relative's house or even what their bedroom looks like (hopefully after a tidy up!). Whilst the children are describing these settings, you could encourage them to use descriptive language as well as similes to aid their descriptions.

Number bonds are something every child will learn early on in their school career but they come in handy throughout life. This week we will be using number bonds to aid us in our quick addition and subtraction calculations, for example, 27 + 6 = ? could be tricky getting past that ten barrier of 30. However, using our knowledge of number bonds and also that 6 can be expressed as 3+3, we could therefore quickly add 27 + 3 + 3 = 33. Using our understanding of number bonds can help us create steps in calculations to make it easier for us to solve them. If you would like to support your children at home you could ask them their number bonds. To do this, give your child a number and ask them what they would need to add to it to get to the next multiple of 10, for example 42 + ? = 50? or 72 + ? = 80?

In history this week, we have been putting on our archaeologist hats to investigate different artefacts from the Stone Age. When we looked at an artefact we discussed it and asked questions about it to try and discover what it was used for, for example we looked at a sharp stone and asked if it was part of an axe, spear or knife or just in fact a stone? Through discussion and historical enquiry we have been seeing what these things can tell us about how people of the time lived and how they made and used tools to help them in their everyday life.

On the days when children come to school in their PE kit, please can we remind you that their kit must follow our school uniform policy. PE kits include a plain white t-shirt and royal blue shorts. However, with the colder months now upon us, children may also wear a royal blue hoodie and either black, grey or navy jogging bottoms.


