Assistant Headteacher Update



Please remember next week is the final week of the Autumn Term. Children may wear their Christmas jumpers on Monday and Tuesday, but they must continue to wear the rest of their school uniform. Monday after school is our Christmas Fayre and we hope that you can all make it. Wednesday, 21st. is our last day, we will be finishing at 12:30 and children are able to wear their own clothes on that day.

In Year 3, we have been enjoying our new guided reading book, 'The Great Chocoplot', which tells the story of young Jelly and her family who live in the chocolate factory town of Chompton-on-de-Lyte. They are devastated to hear the announcement of a chocopocalypse (the end of chocolate!) which was predicted by the ancient people of Easter Egg Island. This story has influenced our recent news articles in writing where, as journalists, we have been reporting on how this disastrous event affected the people of 'Chompton-on-de-Lyte', including use of emotion and speech to convey how devastated the townspeople were that the prediction came true!

In maths, we are still focusing on multiplication and division and have been learning several methods to help us multiply and divide in questions involving the 3, 4 and 8 times tables. Our main methods include writing the times tables out to help us count in 3s ,4s and 8s, arrays, sharing circles and number lines. We have been exploring the relationship between the two operations and how we can use the inverse operation to help us find the answer to trickier problems and 'dig deeper' by using our knowledge of the times table facts to answer questions such as 18 x 4. If you have any questions about these methods, please speak to your child's class teacher and they will be able to explain them fully to you.

The highlight of the term so far has got to be our trip to Flag Fen! We had such a wonderful day enhancing our understanding of what life was like during the Stone Age and Bronze Age. The children had a fantastic time and were great ambassadors for the school. They wowed the activity leaders with their amazing knowledge recall, showing what they have learnt and retained in our history and geography lessons this autumn term! They thoroughly enjoyed the activities, such as making their clay pots, trying to hunt a deer with their spears, handling artefacts and experiencing what it was like to live in a Stone Age roundhouse. Flag Fen is also home to a small flock of rare breed Soay Sheep which shed their own wool and the children were amazed to see them roaming around the site as we were walking around - an extra exciting addition to the day!

Thank you for your continued support over the Autumn Term. We hope that you enjoy the Christmas holidays and have a fun filled, yet relaxing time. If you are celebrating, we wish you a Merry Christmas and a Happy New Year and we look forward to seeing you on 4th. January for the beginning of the Spring term and the start of our new and exciting topics.

Keeping your child safe in the community

With the recent sudden drop in temperatures, and the high amount of lakes in our local community, it is increasingly more important to ensure that your child/ren understand how to keep themselves safe.

The dangers of thin ice, as our local lakes start to freeze, is significant and children may feel tempted to want to explore this change in the environment.


Across school, we have had in depth discussions regarding the dangers of thin ice, and we ask that you follow this up at home, particularly if your child walks home alone/is sout in the community alone.



Key points to discuss with your child:

- You can never be sure how frozen a lake is, and with the water frozen or not the risk of drowning is a serious threat.
- The ice may look thick enough to hold your weight, but you can't assume this. In most cases this can cause a fatal threat.
- Each and every year, people unexpectedly break through the ice and suffer serious injuries or even death.
- Cold water shock is a serious risk if you fall through the ice this
 is where you automatically gasp for air, but breathe in liquid.
- Always stay with friends when out alone playing/walking home in case of an emergency.
- Avoid the lakes to ensure safety.

Funding is available through the cost-of-living crisis for a range of measures to help vulnerable. lower income residents through the winter months.

If you are facing problems with maintaining a warm and comfortable home environment, we may be able to assist with the following measures:

- Boiler replacements due to breakdowns / energy inefficiency including the loan of emergency portable heaters whilst work is on order
- Boiler repairs up to £500
- Boiler servicing
- Installation of Thermostatic Radiator Valves to control room temperatures
- · Smart boiler / heating controls where appropriate
- Damp proofing
- Essential repairs linked to electrical and heating issues
- Electrical upgrades and new installations
- Double glazing of single glazed door and windows


