Assistant Headteacher Update

Last week, after two years of parents' evenings over Zoom, it was lovely to see you all in person coming into school to meet your child's teacher. For some of you, it was the first time you had actually been into school and it was wonderful to see your reactions first hand when you saw how much the environment has changed.

It has been a great start to this half term. We have come back refreshed and ready to begin our next unit of work. In writing, we have been looking at some of Roald Dahl's characters from a variety of his stories. We initially focused on Mr Twit and his hideous appearance and then moved on to his vile personality. We collaboratively generated some fantastic vocabulary which we applied in our character descriptions. The following week, we analysed Miss Trunchbull, who we felt had a similarly horrid personality. We discussed her physical appearance and characteristics and the manner in which she treats innocent, young children. To fully immerse ourselves into this topic, we arranged a visit from Miss Trunchbull. We were astounded by her dislike of children and wondered why she was a Headteacher at all! Thankfully, Miss Trunchbull allowed the children to ask her some questions, which meant that they were able to gain a deeper understanding of her character and apply this in their writing. Next week, we are going to create our own 'Twit' child who will be just as mischievous and horrid as the characters we have already looked at. Do ask your children to tell you more about this.

We are continuing with the theme 'The Stone Age' in our History and Geography lessons and have begun to discuss why early settlers chose the Peterborough area to make their home. We are extremely fortunate in our geographical location with regards to the Stone Age, as there is an abundance of history right here in Peterborough that we can draw on in our lessons. We are looking forward to our upcoming trip to Flag Fen on Wednesday, 7th December, where we will be able to see some of the artefacts that we have been learning about in our lessons, which have been unearthed in this area.

Next week we will begin our Design Technology lessons. In this unit, we will be focusing on food packaging. In order to help prepare the children, please encourage your child to look closer at packaging, particularly at the information which is provided on the packet. This may include the ingredients, the nutritional information and serving suggestions. They may also want to look at the colours and fonts which have been used on the packaging and finally the material that has been used to make it. We look forward to learning more about the marketing strategies which companies use to encourage customers to buy their products in coming lessons and we will finish the unit by making our own packaging for a cereal of our choice.

We would also like to thank you for your continued support as we have once again raised money for the Royal British Legion through the Poppy Appeal. This week we have also taken the opportunity to remind everyone to reach out and show each other the support we need during anti-bullying week. We have, amongst other things, worn odd socks to celebrate what makes us all unique. Finally, thank you to everyone who helped raise a fantastic amount of money today for Children in Need. It was a delight seeing so many of the children in their bright clothes or Pudsey themed items, walking around the school. We should have worn our sunglasses!







In the digital world, it has numerous forms – such as hurtful comments on a person's posts or profile; deliberately leaving them out of group chats; sharing embarrassing images or videos of someone; or spreading gossip about them. Cyber-bullying can severely impact a young person's mental health ... so, in support of Anti-Bullying Week, we've provided a list of tips to help trusted adults know what to look for and how to respond to it.
