Assistant Headteacher Update



The wonderful start to our new school year is continuing, with the children now fully immersed in the whole curriculum we offer here at Hampton Vale. It has been lovely to see the children selecting their reading books and taking them home to share with you. The children will be awarded a star each time they read three times at home. Once the children receive 25 stars they will be awarded their Bronze Reading Award. Reading regularly will not only improve your child's fluency, but it will also improve their vocabulary as well as supporting them with their spelling and punctuation when writing, not to mention developing their imagination.

Teachers are continuing to set homework on Google Classroom, thank you for submitting it once it has been completed. If you have any questions about the homework, Google Classroom, or if you are unsure how to access it, please speak to your child's class teacher.

In our Maths lessons, Year 4 has been applying our place value knowledge to order, compare and round numbers up to 10,000. As well as this, we have been deepening our understanding by using mathematical language to reason and problem solve different 'real-life' mathematical scenarios. We also learnt a very catchy song about Roman numerals and we found out how they influenced the number system we use today. The song proved to be very popular and embedded the knowledge we learnt about the Roman in Year 3

We have been fully absorbed in our new science biology topic 'Living things and their habitats'. It has been very interesting to find out about how animals' features adapt over time so that they are better suited for survival in their habitats. Did you know that zebras are black and white because lions are unable to see them clearly in the grassland and the stripes hypnotise them. We have also discussed the differences between the habitats found in the UK, Hampton and even our school!

Our sketches of the Egyptian pharaoh, Tutankhamun, have blown Miss Richardson away in Art! We used a step-by-step approach to carefully depict his features and ensure the correct scale. After completing an outline, we overlapped yellow and orange tones to create a gold effect. We were so proud of our finished pieces and we hope that you will be able to see them soon.

There has certainly been a change in weather, and with the arrival of the rain and cold days, please remember to bring wellies and appropriate clothing, especially on Forest School and PE days. CONNECTING WITH STRANGERS

Even if your child only connects on the opp with people flwy know, they may still receive hierd requests from strangers. Snapchot's links with oppe such as Wink and hosp here increased this possibility. Accepting a request means that children are then disclosing personal information through the Story, Snapkap and Spottight features. This could allow predators to gain their trust for sinister purposes.

EXCESSIVE USE

There are many fectures that are attractive to users and here there excited about the ope. Imop attracts encourage users to send snops daily. Spotlight Challenges give users to the chance to obtain money and online hame, and the Spotlight feature's scroll of videos makes it easy for children to spend hours watching content.

INAPPROPRIATE CONTENT

Some videos and posts on Snapchat are not suitable for children. The heatrops used to group content are determined by the poster, so an innocent search term could still yield age-inappropriate results. The app's Discover function lets users terps through shippets of news elorise and trending articles that often include adult content. There is currently no way to turn of this footure.

Snapchot is a photo- and video-sharing app which also allows users to chat with friends via text or audio Users can share imaget and videos with specific friends, or through a "story" (documenting the previous 24 hours) visible to the rentire friend list. Snapchot usage rose during the pondemic, with many young people utilising it to connect with their peers. The app continues to develop features to engage an even larger audience and emulate current trends, rivalling platforms such as TikTek and Instagram.

SEXTING

Sexting continues to be a risk associated with Inductor, The app's disappearing messiges' feature makes it easy for young people (teens in particular) to share explicit images on impulse. While these pictures de disappear - and the sender is notified if it has been screamholted first users have found alternative methods to save images, such as taking pictures with a separate device.

DAMAGE TO CONFIDENCE



The potential issue with a young person consistently checking into locations on Snapchat is that it allows other users in their friends list (even people they have only ever met anine) to see where they currently are and where they regularly ge.

What Parents & Carers Need to Know about

TikTak is a video-sharing social media app which lets people creats, view and download leoping 15-second clips. Typically, these are videos of users IIp-syncing and dancing to popular songs or soundbites (after for comic purposes), enhanced with filters, effects and text. Designed with young people in mind, TikTok skyrocketed in popularity in 2019 and has featured near the top of download charts ever since. It now has pround a billion users wordtwide.

AGE-INAPPROPRIATE CONTENT

Note videos oppositing on a chief's feed are light-ficented and amusing however, some slips have been reported for featuring drug and alcohol obuse. themes of suicide and self-ficent, or young leens acting in a security suggestive way. The sheer wature of uploads is impossible to maderate entrely – and since TikTak Jump's introduction in mid-2021, users can view inite-party content outside the app.

EXPLICIT SONGS

This for primarily revolves pround videos of users lip-syncing and dencing to music inswitchin, some feithund songs will contain explicit or suggestive hyrics. Given the oppreyoung user-feets, there is a risk that athildren may view other users' videos and then be inclined to initiate any explicit longuage or suggestive octions.

TIKTOK FAME

The app has created its own celebrities: Charli D'Amelia and Ui Has X, for example, were categorised to fame by experience on TikTak leading to many more teams attempting to go vital and become "TikTak famous". While most asplring stars hoping to be the nest big thing will find it difficult, estbacks may in turn prompt them to go to even more

HAZARDOUS VISIBILITY

Connecting with others is elimpte on TikTok – instading Commenting on and reacting to users visited, latiowing their profile and downloading their content. The majority of these interactions are harmless, but – because of its abundance of teen users – TikTok has experienced problems with predators contacting young people.


ADDICTIVE NATURE

Lice all social media, TikTok is designed to be be addictive. It can be hugely entertaining but that also makes it hard to put down. As well as the punchy nature of the short video format, the app's ability to keep users intrigued about what's corning next mean it's day for a 8-minute visit to turn into a 6-minute stay.

IN-APP SPENDING

There's an in-app option to purchase "Tik tox coins", which are then converted inte digital rewards for sending to content creators that a user likes. Prices range from Stp to an eyer watering CSO bundle. Tik Tok is also connected with Shopify, which allows users to buy products through the app.

Advice for Parents & Carers

TALK ABOUT ONLINE CONTENT

Assuming your child is above TikTok's age limit, talk to them about what they've viewed on the app. Ask their opinion on what's appropriate and what lan't. Explain why they shouldn't give out personal details or optood videos which reveal information like their school or home address. In the long run, teaching them to think critically about what they see on TikTok could help them to become social-media savey.

MAINTAIN PRIVACY SETTINGS



Under Screen Fime Management', you can limit the daily parmitted time on the app (in increments ranging from 40 minutes to two hours). This preference can also be locked behind a FIM. 


