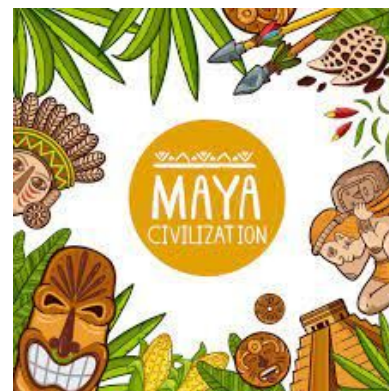


Year 5 News

Assistant Headteacher Update

Thank you parents and carers for all your support this term - the children are feeling a lot more settled now with their new surroundings and class expectations; learning is really taking off and it's wonderful to see how well everyone is achieving. The science curriculum has really taken off with experiments underway already: Year 6 have been observing the spread of mold on bread; whilst Year 5 have been observing the transformation from a maggot to a fly...quite remarkable! Next week, the children will be running their mini marathon in P.E so please ensure your child brings in their water bottle and has a good breakfast.

Mayan Workshop: Throughout this week, each class has been treated to a full day workshop about the Ancient Mayans. Simon (a real life explorer) led a fun-filled day of Mayan facts and activities, team building skills and captivating anecdotes of his own experiences of the Amazon rainforest. The children were hooked from the first few minutes and had an excellent day of asking questions and building their own knowledge.



Maggots!: Some very special (and quite disgusting!) visitors arrived in the Year 5 classrooms this week - **MAGGOTS!** As part of their Science learning about life-cycles, the children have watched the life-cycle of a maggot turn into a fly right before their very eyes. The children (and staff!) were a little bit apprehensive at first, but they are now completely hooked on seeing the daily transformations. Thank you Mrs Lartey for organising a great experiment!

Writing & Reading: We are now coming to the end of our second writing unit where the children have written a diary entry from a character from our class book, *Holes*. The children have shown a brilliant understanding of the characters and empathised with the challenges that they have faced. Everyone has been totally immersed in the story and can't wait to see how the story ends.

Maths: Year 5 have continued developing their addition and subtraction skills this week. They have applied a variety of methods to worded questions and are showing excellent progress with their reasoning and problem solving strategies.

Message from the Teachers: A gentle reminder that all Year 5 children need to come into school wearing their PE kit on Monday 17th October for the Netball and Basketball tournament. They must also remember a water bottle and a coat as some of the activities are outside!

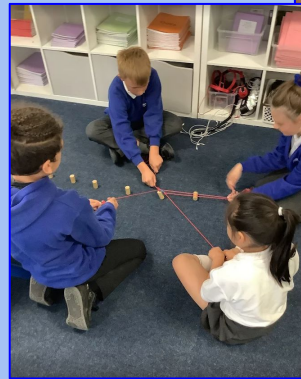
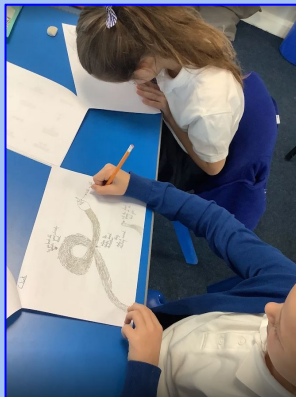
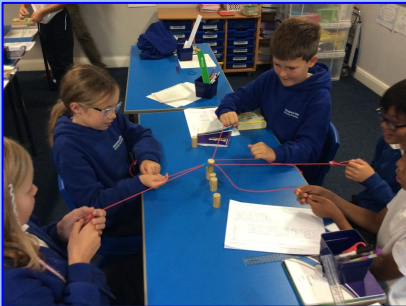
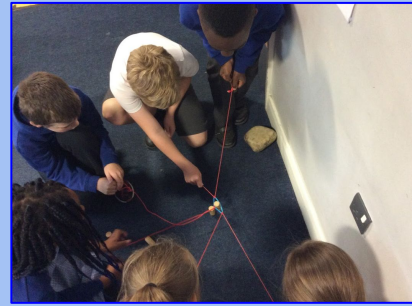
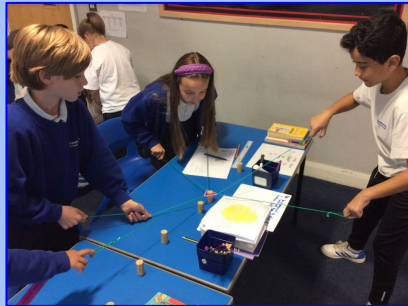
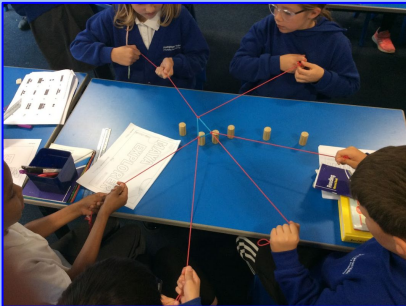
