Assistant Headteacher Update



Reading

The children are thoroughly enjoying our book 'Holes'; as the story unfolds, we are beginning to make links from the past that have led the main character Stanley to his current place in Camp Green Lake. We have used the skill retrieval to recall facts and information that they have learned from the text. Last week we focused on vocabulary, exploring the meaning of tier two (fancy vocabulary) and high frequency words in the text.

Writing

Our new writing unit involves creating a selection of diary entries, beginning with exploring a diary from Stanley (Holes) before he is sent to the camp. We have generated vocabulary which reflects a character's emotions, and discussed at length the different synonyms of simple feelings - a variety of synonyms for feelings has given us the chance to delve deeper into the characters mind. Ask your child to tell you what an emotion sentence is!

Maths

Moving on from place value, the children have been using column addition with numbers in the thousands. We have been impressed with their prior knowledge of this skill and they have been able to apply it to tricky reasoning and problem solving questions.

Geography

This week we have conducted our first piece of fieldwork, through creating simple rain gauges and logging temperatures. Over the week we will be making observations and recording data to find out how much rainfall and different temperatures we get in Hampton Vale this week. Ultimately our goal is to compare the climate in the uk to the climate in Mexico.

Science

Our first Biology unit has involved learning about the life cycle of different species including amphibians and humans (birds and reptiles are up next!). We will continue to explore different species as the unit continues. Our main focus is for our children to be able to compare different animals of the same species and explain why they are similar or different.

CONNECTING WITH STRANGERS

Even if your child only connects on the opp with people flaw, know, they may still receive friend requests from strangers, Snapchaf's links with oppe such as Wink and Hoop here increased this possibility. Accepting a request means that children are then disclosing personal information through the Story, SnapMap and Spottight features. This could allow predators to goin their trust for sinister purposes.

EXCESSIVE USE

Spotlight Challenges give users to the chance to obtain money and online hame, and the Spotlight leature's scral of videos makes it easy for children to spend hours watching content.

INAPPROPRIATE CONTENT

Some videos and pasts on Snapchat are not suitable for children. The heshtags used to group content are determined by the paster, so an innecemt search term could still yield age-inappropriate results. The app's Discover function lets users swipp through snippets of news elonies and tranding articles that often include adult content. There is currently no way to turn of this feature.

snapchat is a photo- and video- sharing app which also allows users to chat with friends via test or outlio lisers can share imaget and videos with specific friends, acthrough a 'stary' (documenting the previous 24 hours) visible to the rentire friend list. Snapchat usage rase during the pondemic, with many young people utilising it to connect with their peers. The app continues to develop features to engage an even larger oudience and emulate current trends, rivalling platforms such as Tistlek and instagram.

SEXTING

Seating continues to be a risk associated with trapphot, The app's disappearing messiges' feature makes it easy for young people (seens in particular) to share explicit images on impulse. 

Comparing themselves unfavourably against other snapchot users could threatien a child's confidence or series of solf-worth.

VISIBLE LOCATION

My Process lets users check in ord search for popular spols nearby - such as restaurants, parks or shopping centres ond recommand them to their triends. The potential issue within a young person consistently checking into locations on Snapchat is that it allows other users in their friends list (even people have only ever met online) to see where they currently are and where they regularly ge.

What Parents & Carers Need to Know about

TikTok is a video-sharing social media app which lets people create, view and download looping 15-second clips. Typically, these are videos of users Tip-syncing and dancing to popular songs or soundbites (often for comic purposes), enhanced with filters, effects and text. Designed with young people in mind, TikTok skyrocketed in popularity in 2019 and has featured near the top of download charts ever since. It now has around a billion users worldwide.

AGE-INAPPROPRIATE CONTENT

Note videoe appearing on a childr's feed are light-featuring and amusing reported for featuring drug and alcohol adure. I herms of suicide and self-horm, or young leens acting in a security suggestive way. EXPLICIT SONGS

Tis tok primarily revolves pround videos of users lip-syncing and dencing to music inswitchly, some festured songs will contain explicit of suggestive tyrics. Given the opp's young user-index, there is a risk that at-lideen may risk other users' videos and then be inclined to initials any explicit language of suggestive options.

TIKTOK FAME

The app has created its own celebrities: Charil D Amelia and UI Hos X, for example, were cataputed to fame by exposure on TikTok leading to many more tears attempting to go viral and become "TikTok famous". While most aspiring stars hoping to be the nest big thing will find it difficult, schooks may in turn grompt them to go to even more

HAZARDOUS VISIBILITY

Connecting with others is simple on TikTok including commenting on and reacting to users' vibros, feltowing their profile and downooding their content. The majority of these interactions are harmless, but becouse of its abundance of isen users -TikTok has experienced problems with predators contacting young people.


ADDICTIVE NATURE

Like all social media, TikTok is designed to be addictive. It can be hugely ententiating but that also makes it hard to put down. As well as the punchy nature of the short videoformat, the app's ability to keep users intrigued about what's coming next mean it's doay for a 8-minute visit to turn into a 46-minute stay.

IN-APP SPENDING

There's an in-app option to purchase "Tartox coins", which are then converted ime digital rewards for sending to content areators that a user likes. Prices range from 35p to an eye watering £50 bundle. TikTok is also connected with Shopfly, which allows users to buy products through the app.





Advice for Parents & Carers

TALK ABOUT ONLINE CONTENT

Assuming your child is above TisTok's age limit, talk to them about what they've viewed on the app. Ask their opinion on what's appropriate and what ian't. Replain why they shouldn't give out personal details or uptood videos which reveal information like their school or norme address. In the long run, teaching them to think critically about what they see on TisTak could help them to become social-media savey.

MAINTAIN PRIVACY SETTINGS

The delouit setting for all under His' accounts to private'. Keeping it that way is the sofiest solution: I means only users who your child approves can each their videos. The 'filtch' (which lets users optice diss from ather people's videos into their own) and 'Duel' (where you build on another user's content by recording your own video atongside their original redures are now only available to over 10s. This might clash with your child's ambitions of social media standom but it will forthy their account against predators.

ENABLE FAMILY PAIRING

Family Fairing' lets parents and covers link their own TikTak account to their child's. Through your mobile, you can account your child's solety settings remately – including limiting screen time, managing their ability to exchange messages (and with when) and blecking a lot of age-imageropriors content. TikTak's Solety Centre also provides resources for parents and covers to support online safety among families. These resources can be found on their website.

MODERATE SCREEN TIME

As entertaining as TikTok is, you can help your child to manage their time on it in the 'Digital Wellbeing' soction. Under Screen Fime Management', you can limit the daily parmitted Time on the app (in increments ranging from 40 minutes to two hours). This preference can also be locked beford a FIN. That way, your child can get their regular dass of Marak without exaiting the whole day.
