In writing we have been learning about explanation texts. We wrote an explanation text designed for tourists who travel to earthquake prone areas. We included lots of relative clauses, complex sentences and formal language.

In maths, we have been focusing a lot on multiplication and division. For the next week, we have a year group battle on TT Rockstars with the winning class getting extra playtime! Please encourage your children to log on and earn their class some points.

In P.E we have been practising hard for the mini mile which we run next Tuesday.

Science has been the real star of the show in the Y6 curriculum of late. Our mould experiments were very successful, much to our disgust. We are now observing fungi and how they look under a microscope. Washington class had a fantastic time exploring how to use the microscopes and what we saw was fascinating.


