Assistant Headteacher Update continued

What a wonderful start we have had! Throughout Year 5 and 6, the children have settled in superbly. It was so uplifting to hear about everyone's summer as well as talking through what they are looking forward to this year and answering/addressing any questions and worries they had. Building the teacher-pupil relationships are crucial when starting any year: setting the boundaries and class expectations whilst still getting to know everyone individually.

To kick start their topics, we have had a hook for Year 5's Ancient Mayan topic and a hook for Year 6's Japan & Natural disasters topic. We want to inspire and excite the children early on and support them in knowing how their learning relates to the real world. They were all so engrossed in the learning and I know many are eager for their next lesson. What an incredible start to the term we are having! They are all settling into their final year in primary school beautifully; they are working hard to show us how seriously they are taking their commitment to their learning and giving 100% effort in all they do. Keep it up, Year Six!

In maths, we have been working to extend our place value knowledge, by identifying the value of digits in numbers over 1 million, comparing numbers and calculating with negative numbers. We have then moved onto addition and reviewing our efficiency when working through column addition problems.

In writing, we have been working to understand how to write a setting description, practising our skills of using prepositional phrases, metaphors and similes to develop detailed descriptions. We have especially focused on our use of figurative language, honing in on personification as a fantastic way to uplevel our descriptions of idyllic beaches and abandoned gardens!

In reading, we have begun reading our class text of 'Running Wild' by Michael Morpurgo, and are working to improve our retrieval and inference skills. We are also enjoying our visits to our reading 'Wonderland' in school, where we can enjoy reading individually, in pairs and with an adult. We have also completed reading assessments this week, enabling us to see the children's current reading age and abilities.

We are enjoying our foundation and specialist subjects, especially our first lessons on Japan and natural disasters - in our 'hook' lesson we made a 'what I know already' and 'what I want to know' display and had fun testing our prior knowledge on continents, countries and famous landmarks. We can't wait to tell you more about these lessons as we move through our units!

Do you have a concern about a child?

Hampton Vale Primary Academy is committed to safeguarding and promoting the welfare of children and expects all staff, governors and volunteers to share this commitment.

At Hampton Vale there is nothing more important to us than the physical health, emotional health and well-being of our pupils and staff alike.

If you have any concerns about a child, you can contact or speak to your child's class teacher/teaching assistant before or after school, speak to a member of the Senior Leadership Team or our Safeguarding Lead. All our staff will always listen to concerns about the safety and wellbeing of a child. You can also email safeguarding@hvp.org.uk.

A safeguarding concern is anything that makes you feel worried or uncomfortable about a child or concerned that a child may be at risk of harm or at risk of harming another. This includes your perception of the risk of radicalisation, sexual exploitation and any other form of child abuse (emotional, physical, neglect or sexual). It also includes self-harm or the use of drugs/alcohol.

We have a number of policies and procedures in place that contribute to our safeguarding commitment, including our Child Protection Policy. This can be found in the Safeguarding section of our website.

The Academy has a safeguarding team led by the Deputy Safeguarding Lead, Mrs Wright and Designated Safeguarding and Prevent Lead, Miss Thomas.

Online Safety: Parental Controls

These controls are designed to help you manage your child's online activities. Parental controls can set online time restrictions for your child and create content filters to manage the content they see. Parental controls can be used across your broadband, Wi-Fi, apps, games consoles and personal devices including mobile phones and tablets. There are various types, some of which are free but others which can be bought.

You can find instructions on how to set controls on the manufacturer's website or to find specific guidance for your device, network or platform use this online tool from Internet Matters.

Control settings will apply whether the device is being used in your home or outside. It's also easy for controls to be switched off, so make sure your child understands why the settings are in place.

You can put parental controls on the following:

- Games consoles controls
- Broadband and network controls to prevent inappropriate material
- Online controls Google and other search engines
- Social media and other websites Youtube have privacy and security settings
- Paid controls you can buy filter programmes

5 actions for setting parental controls:

- 1. Set up home broadband parental controls
- Set controls on your search engine and encourage your child to use child friendly search engines and activate and lock the safe search setting on the platforms/browsers they use
- Set privacy settings on apps and devices: activate the safety measures offered by different sites
- 4. Block pop-ups to reduce accidentally clicking on inappropriate material
- Have open conversations with your child about online safety and reassure them they can talk to you or a trusted adult whenever they need to
